



USDA EXPORT VERIFICATION (EV) PROGRAM: SPECIFIED PRODUCT REQUIREMENTS FOR OVINE AND CAPRINE

1 Purpose

This document provides the specified product requirements for marketing U.S. ovine and caprine items under the USDA Export Verification (EV) Program. This Program facilitates the international trade of U.S. ovine and caprine meat and meat products for those countries that require products to be derived from animals less than 12 months of age.

2 Scope

These requirements apply to U.S. suppliers (harvests, fabricators, and processors) of ovine and/or caprine items that are eligible for export as listed on the Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) website. Suppliers who wish to label and sell product as meeting the specified product requirements for ovine and/or caprine under this Program must meet these requirements through an approved USDA Quality System Assessment (QSA) Program.

4 Responsibilities

U.S. suppliers must meet all policies and procedures outlined in this procedure, QAD 1000 Procedure: *Quality Systems Verification Programs General Policies and Procedures*, and QAD 1002 Procedure: *Quality System Assessment (QSA) Program*.

5 Listing of Approved Programs

Only U.S. suppliers that have an approved USDA QSA Program which meets the specified product requirements for this program will be listed on the [Official Listing of Eligible Suppliers to the USDA Ovine and Caprine EV Program](#).

6 Specified Product Requirements

Ovine and caprine meat and meat products must be derived from animals that meet one of the following requirements:



- 6.1 Animals are traceable to live production records which indicate they are less than 12 months of age at the time of harvest; or
- 6.2 Carcasses do not exhibit the dental characteristic of the eruption of a permanent incisor through the gum, as determined during the harvest process.
- 6.3 Fresh/frozen sheep and goat meat and carcasses can originate from animals of any age for Mexico only.
- 6.4 Sheep and goat offal, including heads and feet, must be derived from animals less than 12 months of age and produced under an USDA EV Program for Mexico only.

Note 1: Sheep and Goat casings can be produced from an animal of any age, and do not require an USDA EV Program for Mexico.

7 Shipping Documentation

- 7.1 Identification of conforming product during shipment and delivery must be documented on the shipping documentation (bills of lading, shipping manifests, or letters of guarantee). The shipping documentation must:
 - 7.1.1 Clearly identify the product and product quantity; and
 - 7.1.2 Contain the statement "Product meets EV Program requirements for ovine and caprine."

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
